 welcomed the members present and introduced the guests, Dr. Balbir Gurm and other members
 of the TEAM Surrey School candidates for Surrey School Board
- 2. Adoption of the agenda: M/S Mike Reeves and Zita to adopt the current agenda. Carried

Dr Balbir Gurm talked about:

- Her team of diverse members

- Listening to community and advocating for parents
- Funding needed to improve school system
- Ensuring all students are fed and protected

Tony Rebelo talked about:

- Proper funding for students to have access to counselor/counselling
- Lobbying for more funding from provincial government for the benefit of children
- Working together with different sectors of government
- Supporting and advocating for youth sport program
- Leading by examples, e.g volunteering, coaching students, letting young students be leaders

Bobby Taylor talked about:

- Her experience as a mom of 4 children with varying degree of disability

- Advocating for children with special needs
- Helping create inclusion for families
- 67 positions that were cut back last year and how they affected students who are vulnerable and needed support
- The needed transparency with what is happening to school systems

Dupinder Saran talked about:

- Being residence of Surrey for 47 years and her involvement in community
- Helping residence youth, women with community issues
- Advocating for international students
- Ensuring everyone has access to support
- Connecting with parents on a regular basis to talk about school issues

Maryann Pyne talked about:

- Her life of 17 years in Surrey about moving here from Jamaica
- Her role as a mother of 4 and grandmother of 6 in serving a diverse community
- Advocating students and a Caribbean community activist
- Lack of resources for children, and not having far and equitable access to school resources
- The TEAM from 6 different background
- Listening and recognizing the issues children face

Roxanne Charles talked about:

- Being an activist from Semiahmoo First Nation
- Advocating for systematic change
- Developing inclusion experiences for indigenous people
- Developing youth school
