Guest Speaker Trish Martin

Trish spoke about how to engage members by listening to their concerns and asking them what they are passionate about. Utilizing a combination of 1 on 1 conversation and social media allows unions to get the important information out to the members and connect with them in ways that work for them. High lighting the work that the union does and participating in activities that they are passionate about helps members to connect with their union. She encouraged us to share little wins because these will build into big ones.

Area councils should be sharing what is working for their area with other area councils ie Snap & Chat Saturdays in an effort to connect with our unions. We need to work together to change the conversation for members from “the union” to “my union”.

Jessica- Trying to engage members to register and vote. Commented that some staff are confused and did not realize that they needed to attend training or a meeting before voting.

Heidi- nothing to add

Patty- Essential Services Training is happening on February 15th at 12:00pm. Please let your members know about this training. Members who are concerned or want information on a strike can find self directed training on the PSAC webs site. There is an upcoming strike training on February 21st at 7:00pm. When speaking with staff let them know that their bargaining team would not ask them to go on strike unless it is the only way to get them a fair contract.

Thanked Stacey for the work he has done as treasurer.

Amanda- happy to stay on as Vice President for another 2 years.

Dan- nothing to add but it was good to be invited.

Veena- nothing to add.

Trish- thank you for the invitation.

Brad- things are challenging at work. 15 staff recently left and more are planning to leave. Commented that young workers are afraid of striking because they don't have letters yet.

Celine- UNE is in trusteeship. Commented that she is the West Area Council Vice President and is visiting us to see how we do our work and to hear Trish speak about member

engagement.

Pamela- is hoping to be working with the RCMP shortly

Dave- young workers are not engaged and commented we need to focus on how to get them engaged

Kendy- wants to support other unions who has come out to support them

Alan- would like the EFVAC to come out to Mission institutions to do an outreach event on Wednesday March 22/ 2023 from 11:00-12:20pm. Introduced himself as the area coordinator for the East Fraser Valley area. Commented on the current status with negotiations with the employer. UTE will probably vote first. If they go on strike he plans to take time off to go an support them as their contract will set the tone for the rest of the components. Encouraged everyone to come out and show support as well.

Kirsty- Fraser Valley Institution recently had their AGM and had a really good turn out. Staff are really interested in what is going on around negotiations and striking.

Stacey- is likely going to relocate to the east coast this year. Has about 1/3 of the staff at Mountain engaged. Staff want information on striking and Essential Services Agreements. Commented on all the different unions at the table tonight and thanked everyone to attending.

Krista- happy to be at the meeting tonight and looking forward to participating in mobilization activities.

Antony- letting staff know it is in their best interest to support TB bargaining because what they get is what we will get. Commented that the stronger the strike mandate the better it will be for all members.

Motion to adjourn was made by Amanda.
